Example:- do not include classes as being judged if there were no entries in that class or there were entries but they were all absent Likewise only count the number of dogs present as dogs being judged, see the example below, the column "Number of dogs Judged", when added to the column, "Number of dogs Absent", should total back to the "Number of dogs Entered"

For example, the recording of Melton Mowbray show, it was a 3 class show, there were 6 chows entered making 7 entries. 3 in Junior, 3 in Post Grad and 1 in Open. The one dog in Post Grad was a "seen" dog, this calculation gives 7 entries from just 6 dogs. On the day the single entry in Open class was absent,. So the total number of dogs judged were 5 in 2 classes.
